Please note: there is no deadline to book a school field trip, but space fills up quickly; grant applications are due by Friday, September 15 for Bboyizm and All I Want for Christmas, and Friday, November 10 for all other shows.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE grant

General assistance grants cover the cost of student admissions. Each year, the Playhouse awards 1000+ student admissions in the Anglophone West School District through this grant. Each school can apply for up to 200 students.

All applications will be reviewed by a committee and awarded based on (1) financial need, (2) history of participation; and (3) benefit to students and schools.

TRANSPORTATION subsidy

Decrease your transportation costs by applying for a transportation subsidy. Schools attending one or more of the performances presented by Fredericton Playhouse may be reimbursed for transportation up to \$100.



In My Body

60 mins | Grades 6-12



Street Dance: Fusing influences of street dance and hip-hop into a modern dance context, Bboyizm creates a new extremely physical world that is theatrical, virtuosic, and urban at its very core.

In My Body is a major accomplishment for street dance in Canada. Street dancer/ choreographer Crazy Smooth brings together an intergenerational group of dancers aged 23–57, and an international creative team, for a performance that explores aging and vulnerability. In hip hop culture, having

swagger is critical - being braggadocious and being able to back up that attitude is key. But what happens when dancers age, and the physical demands of dance on the body begin to catch up to the dancer? In My Body welcomes this evolution, and its effects on street dancers.

Founded in 2004 by acclaimed Canadian street dancer Crazy Smooth, Bboyizm believes that authentic self-expression enables an individual – and by extension, a community – to realize its full potential.

Movie-concert: A delightful and entertaining opportunity to discover the early days of cinema. A multi-media show composed of short films by Georges Méliès, pioneer of cinema and wizard of special effects.

Inspired by the cinematographic richness and inventiveness of Georges Méliès, a French illusionist, actor, film director, and creator of cinematic spectacle, Jean François Alcoléa

has devised a unique new way to experience these short films. The show begins with an introduction and commentary, and includes ten of Méliès' best-known films. Each of Méliès' films is given a new, original score, composed by artist and creator Jean-François Alcoléa, and performed with a unique orchestral arrangement of over thirty instruments (including saucepans, wind chimes, musical saw, and many more).

of their undersea world. With lives hanging in the balance and all hope lost, a most unexpected hero rises up. The power of optimism really can save the world!







Todd Parr is an award-winning author and illustrator of more than 71 books for children, and Mermaid Theatre will mark its 50th season with the staged adaptation of one their favorite contemporary storybooks. Todd Parr's

important messages of building confidence, self-expression, celebrating diversity, and taking care of our environment are paramount for today's children. Parr's work is refreshing, bright and joyful with simple thoughts that make profound statements.

It's Okay to Be Different was created with the intention that all children even those on the spectrum would feel safe and calm during the performance.

MONDAY, MAY 27 | 10 A.M. UPPERCUT DANCE THEATRE Benched

45 minutes | Grades 5- 12

Dance theatre: A fusion of street, modern dance, capoeira and acrobatics, Benched is an honest and humorous, bodily tale about life's big and very small questions. It's about settling down, about daring to sit in opposition, about sitting cross legged, and about being sat, put off or benched. We all have to sit on the bench sooner or later.

In Benched, five male dancers perform in Johan Kølkjaer's set design of oversized, mobile benches that are constantly being transformed. Award winning choreographer Stephanie Thomasen examines human relationships and playfully conveys the notion of finding one's place in life.
